The Vishnuh-Society – Truth Without Form

The Vishnuh-Society is not a religious movement. It

recognizes no gods, no saviors, no supernatural laws.
What it *does* recognize is truth – as the only path to true freedom.

Its teaching calls people to self-inquiry, simplicity, service, and responsibility.

Not from fear, but from clarity.

For those who learn to carry themselves no longer need to cling to illusion.

The Inward Path
