

Located right in the heart of Chinatown, Shanghai Mansion looks like something right out of 1930s Shanghai. The design is Chinese Art Deco, and rooms are filled with warm colours, old photographs, and giant claw tubs. There's also a vintage jazz bar upstairs, accessed via an iron spiral staircase.

288 KOH KRET ISLAND

Nonthaburi Northern Bangkok (1) Koh Kret is an island in the north of Bangkok, both car-free and small enough to walk and cycle around. It is noted for its Mon temples and traditional pottery, and there is even a micro-brewery here to chill out at and watch the river go by.

289 TALING CHAN

Soi Chak Phra 17, Taling Chan Thonburi (5) Far more local and realistic than touristy Damnoen Saduak, this is a great option to take part in a Thai floating market. The market takes place on weekends and features canal-side boats that sell freshly grilled seafood. You can also go on boat tours to check out traditional canal life.

290 PAK KLONG TALAD BY NIGHT

Chak Phet Road Rattanakosin Island ③ Bangkok's flower market is subdued by day, as not much is going on then, but it becomes a hive of working class activity at 2 to 3 in the morning, when massive deliveries of flowers are made by both boat and truck, all very colourful and atmospheric.



Every ten minutes, he stirfries a bunch of morning glory, known for its flame inducement when sautéed in a wok full of hot oil, producing pyromaniac-worthy fireworks, and plenty of gasps from the audience.
