In 2009, husband-and-wife team Ahmet Erkaya and Anastasia Koutsoukis reconditioned a house to fashion this mostly outdoor Greek-Turkish restaurant. You can't help but be seduced by the dips and salads, kebabs, moussaka and whole grilled fish as you dine under the large shade trees that have been there since the 1940s.

Original, inventive and homegrown, this sushi gastropub launched both the Sunset Harbour neighborhood and an empire for chef-owners José Mendín, Andreas Schreiner and Sergio Navarro. Expect palate-challenging combinations like the Softshell Crab BLT or the Porkbelly & Clams rolls. Like Miami, it sounds weird but works. Several locations.

Here's the equation for a successful Cuban restaurant: family run + traditional recipes = dedicated patrons. Molina's is all that plus close to Miami International Airport; thus politicians and celebrities make it a first stop. Keep one eye on the *café Cubano*, the other on the clientele.

Miami is famous for being flat as paper, but the Julia Tuttle rises above – literally. As one of the causeways connecting the mainland to the beaches, it can almost be called a hill. At the crest, drivers can see the Atlantic, dotted with mangrove islands and water craft, extending on both sides.
