27 U BARBA Via Pier Candido Decembrio 33 South-East ⑦ +39 02 4548 7032 ubarba.it In a small building, dwarfed by the skyscrapers of Porta Nuova, chef Cesare Battisti prepares dishes that 'express the soul of Milan', sourcing his raw material from local producers. The risottos and meats are excellent. His partner and sommelier Federica Fabi is in charge of the front of house. Games for children in the garden.

A *bocce* club which has become a Genovese tavern. The food is very basic here, and includes *trofie* (short, twisted pasta) with pesto, *pansotti* (stuffed pasta) with walnut sauce, and cheese-stuffed focaccia. You can enjoy their cuisine, that reminds the Milanese of weekends by the sea, at a communal table. Or outdoors, near the *bocce* court. Also open for lunch on weekends.

### 5 cool BARS IN MUSEUMS

The tables also occupy part of the southern portico, through which the horses once entered. The atmosphere is laidback, like in the park where there's an area designed for children.

#### 92 BAR LUCE

The best moment to enjoy the bar, which was designed by Wim Wenders, who won an Oscar for *The Grand Budapest Hotel*, is on weekdays, without the chaos of the weekend.

The baroque structure – which until the 1700s served as the cemetery of Ca' Granda city hospital – with its beautiful portico has since become a bistro. The church of San Michele was transformed into a children's museum a few years ago.

Unlike other bars in the city centre, DeCanto is spacious enough for you to catch your breath. You can browse your guidebook and plan your next visit or take a break before enjoying the Gallerie d'Italia collection. A perfect pit stop while shopping.

One of the stars of the 'Giacomo' constellation, which includes a restaurant in the nearby Arengario and an enclave in Via Sottocorno with a bistro, pastry shop and bar-tobacco shop. They all have the same furniture, atmosphere and vintage dinnerware. The cafe of Palazzo Reale also has a pleasant courtyard and a mezzanine where you can browse old and recent exhibition catalogues.

It's located in the former Agip Supercortemaggiore gas station, known as the 'spaceship', which was commissioned by ENI's founder Enrico Mattei. The building, which has been restored, has a cocktail bar and a restaurant.

Rossana Orlandi has established her creative space in a former tie factory. The original setting, wall furniture and stairs surround an infinite number of drawers. Recently the bistRo opened here. She joined forces with one of Milan's most popular restaurants, Il luogo di Aimo and Nadia (*aimoenadia.com*), for this project.

#### 273 ORTI FIORITI AT CITYLIFE PARK West (8) city-life.it

This tranquil, beautiful oasis is hidden behind the austere Palazzo di Brera, in the centre of Milan. Created in 1774 at the behest of Maria Theresa of Austria, as a haven of pleasure and delight, the Brera Botanical Garden also supplied medicinal plants to the Brera Pharmacy.

This space is situated near the Polytechnic University and close to some faculties of the State University. It is open to the public and is used for scientific research and educational activities. Here the region's native species of the region are preserved and studied. The avant-garde greenhouses host an interesting collection of carnivorous plants.

The CityLife public park will become the city's second 'green lung' and will also have flower gardens. The project includes the cultivation of aromatic and medicinal herbs, flowers and vegetables on 3000 square metres of city land.

A former racetrack. In the 1920s Parco Trotter became the *Casa del Sole*, a special school with a state-of-the-art garden with an educational function. Today it's listed as Environmental Heritage and is always teeming with mothers and children who live in this multicultural neighbourhood.

The opening is always a society event. Guests show off their eccentric hats and colourful clothes, which are all very flowery. It is a pleasure to stroll among the many plant varieties and rare and ancient flowers in the morning when there are fewer people and to stop for a chat with the nursery owners.



### 5 CONTEMPORARY **ART STOPS**

#### 356 FABBRICA **DEL VAPORE**

North-West 🔟 fabbricadelvapore.org

A 30.000-square-metre space, that is half covered and is dedicated to all artforms Via G. C. Procaccini 4 including visual, performative and multimedia. The fabbrica is situated in premises that once belonged to a railway equipment factory, with sheds, buildings with large windows and an art nouveau design, where young artists can also reside. Check the online events calendar.

#### 357 FONDAZIONE PRADA

Largo Isarco 2 South-East (7) +39 02 5666 2611 fondazioneprada.org Rem Koolhaas's OMA studio has juxtaposed the existing buildings of an early-20th-century distillery with three new buildings, called Podium, Cinema and Tower. The latter, which was inaugurated in 2018, offers an unprecedented view of the city through the large windows and from the rooftop bar. All the spaces host artworks and installations from the Prada collection.

A full 'red-and-black' immersion.

From onesies to teddy bears wearing the Milan jersey, to a plush ball, tracksuits and bathrobes for older kids and adults. Many of the official products can be customised on the spot for a fun gift. In the city centre or available online.

Black and blue is the theme of this store. And in 2018, to mark the team's 110th anniversary (it was founded in 1908), they launched a series of celebratory products, including signed t-shirts. And smartphone covers that can be personalised with your name.

The arena is named after Gianni Brera, a journalist and sports writer. But the arena is Italy's oldest stadium and home to Inter Milan for over twenty years. Here the first championship, the first pennant, and the first Italian Cup were won. Long before Inter, the arena was once filled with water, hosting naval battles.

## 5 UNESCO SITES (out of 10 in Lombardy)

#### 471 BERGAMO

CARRARA ACADEMY Piazza Giacomo Carrara 82 +39 035 234 396 lacarrara.it The walls – which were built by the Republic of Venice from 1561 onwards, and which are just over 5 km long – became a UNESCO site in 2017. Follow them to the upper town, which you can also reach by funicular, to Piazza Vecchia, with the Colleoni Chapel that charmed Le Corbusier. The marvellous Carrara Academy recently reopened in lower Bergamo.

### 475 CREMONA

This 'ideal company town' was built by the Crespi family, next to its textile factory, along the river Adda. The employees and their families had a house with a vegetable garden and a yard, as well as a communal indoor pool. Also worth visiting is the moving cemetery.

Built in 753 AD by the Longobard King Desiderius, the Santa Giulia Museum is a former convent. Visit the Longobard basilica, the Romanesque oratory, the Choir of the nuns, the 16th-century church of Santa Giulia and the cloisters. The Pinacoteca Tosio Martinengo, with works by Raphael, Romanino, Hayez and Canova, is also worth a visit.

Along with Mantua, which is also on the UNESCO heritage list, Sabbioneta is one of the symbols of the Renaissance. This small 'independent state', an 'ideal city', was built from scratch in the second half of the 1500s by Vespasiano Gonzaga. The hexagonal city wall has been preserved.

The sound of violins resounds throughout the city, from over 150 violin shops and the Violin Museum. On special occasions, you can hear some of the historical instruments in the Auditorium, which has perfect acoustics. The Duomo and the Torrazzo, Europe's tallest brick tower, are also worth visiting.
